A big thanks to Mrs Bailey and Mrs Memorey who attended with the group, they weren't too tired on the next day.


I would also like to thank all the families who man-

The students visited places such as Parliament House, the War Memorial, Questacon (Science Museum), National Gallery of Australia, National Museum of Australia as well as a night tour to Mount Ainslie to see the night lights.

The excursion was subsidised by the Australian Government. The government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civic and Citizenship education. To assist families the Australian Government contributed \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civic Education Rebate program. The rebate was paid directly to the school upon return from Canberra. The rebate was deducted from the total cost charged to parents.




