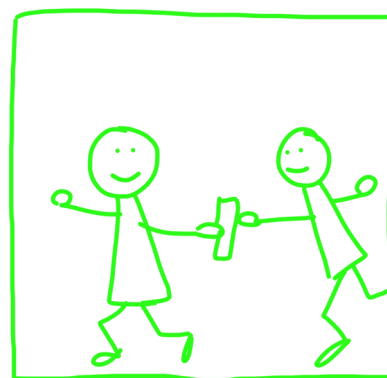


Hawkesbury District Athletics Carnival

The event is a fundraiser for the P&C. Students will be provided with sponsorship forms and information about how they could win prizes. Notes will be sent out in the next week.

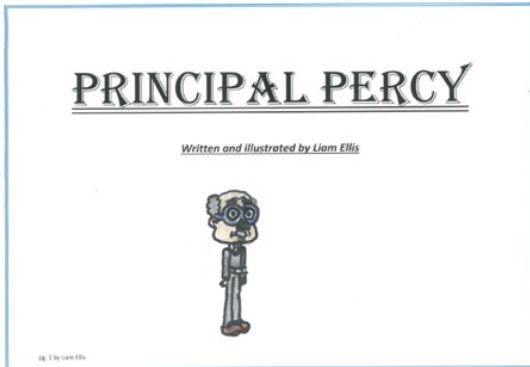
We also encourage parents to take part on the day. It will be a great way to finish the term.

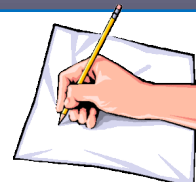
