# Winter is here! It has been extremely cold this week and we have had a few students unwell. I sent this information home last newsletter and again this time.

- \* All jumpers/jackets should be labelled with your child's name.
- \* The school has beanies and scarves for sale to keep children warm.

\* Children can bring food to heat up but remember that we will only heat up food for each child **twice** a week.

\*Due to the rain and seasonal changes, there has been a few

illnesses like flus, colds and stomach bugs. Please monitor children for any symptoms.

\* If your child is sick they will need to have a RAT to ensure your child does not have COVID before they return to school. (see below).

#### **COVID** Continues

Unfortunately COVID is still around so please continue to monitor your child(ren) for any symptoms regarding COVID please Use the RAT to make sure.

\* If the result is positive, your child(ren) need to stay home and isolate for 7 days.

• There are no 'close contact' rules as it has changed. If a member of your family is COVID positive but the student has no symptoms and has tested negative on a RAT, they are able to come to school.





## **School Athletics Carnival**

A note was sent home on Wednesday regarding a change to our annual Athletics Carnival. Because of the recent weather and the current work that is being done to the oval next to the school we have no chance of using it this year for our carnival.
